


Region 4-2A and 4-4A UIL Academic Meets

Bus drops & parking: You will approach the university on Ocean Drive. Turn right into the campus at the second stoplight (Sand Dollar Boulevard). Take another immediate right to drop students off in the circle drive near Bay Hall and the Center for the Arts. After drop-off, busses should drive back across Sand Dollar Blvd and park in the Hammerhead Parking Lot.
