Renaissance (1400-1600)

Art

Bright, pure colors (often primary) Formal compositions Formal subjects: history and legend (many religious themes), portraits (important people) Development of oil painting Perspective

Rebirth of classical learning Invention of the printing press Busy commerce, growth of middle class

Baroque (1600-1750)

Art

Composition still formal, attention to detail Strong sense of movement and emotion Strong contrasts between light and dark areas of canvas Original art in ordinary households Genre, still life, and landscape become popular subjects Styles / movements - Rococo (late in period)

Rise of Protestantism Scientific discoveries: knowing the real world

Modern (1750-1900)

Art
