 for the past two years, very little participation is expected this year in some literary and academic contests under the newconference B alignment. Chief reasons for this declining participation are the limited faculties and small student bodies
During 1957-58, conference B schools (which then included the present conference A schools) had only 26 districts with districts had 100 per cent participation by all schools in the the debate contest from 127 conference B districts. And many of these teams came from schools with enrollments of 119-200,

conference B schools usually enter these contests: spelling, coady writing, number sense, declamation, one-act play, typewriting and poetry reading. These contests appear to be more
