How to read and answer questions

To answer the questions on this test, you'll need to know how to read chess moves. It's simple to do.

Every square on the board has an "address" made up of a letter and a number.




At right are two sample moves.

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
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What move(s) by White will end the game in stalemate?



How can White checkmate Black in one move?

Correct answer: (a)

1. Ξ h6! # is checkmate in one as there are no King moves and the White Rook cannot be captured since the g7 pawn in pinned.



#4. Answer

Which side has a material advantage?

Correct answer: (b)

As the Black Queen is worth 9 points and the White Rook (5 points) and 3 extra Pawns (3 points) are worth a combined total of 8 points, Black is ahead on **material.**
