TIMES AND LOCATIONS

Coaches Conference

A brief coaches' meeting will take place prior to the contest on Friday, May 6, at **10:00 a.m. in UTC 4.134**. Due to space constraints the meeting will be for coaches only.

Written Test

All contestants must take the **WRITTEN TEST**, which is scheduled for **10:30 a.m., Friday, May 6**.

Contest Rooms

All contestants should plan to be present in their contest room by 10:30 a.m.

Individual placement is determined solely by scores on the written test. Individual awards will be presented immediately following verification of results **in UTC 2.102A at 3:30 PM**.

Hands-On Programming

The **PROGRAMMING SESSION** will take place on **Friday, May 6, in the San Jac Multipurpose Room (SJH 207)**. Setup will begin at **5 PM** and continue through the dry run and preliminary announcements. **All teams should arrive to begin programming setup at 5 PM**. The contest itself will begin at approximately **6:30 PM, or earlier if setup is complete**. Awards will be presented at approximately **9 PM in SJH 207**.

Coaches of advancing teams will be contacted via email with additional information about equipment needs and setup procedures. Each team must provide their own equipment. Each team may use only one computer for the contest, which means one system, one monitor and one keyboard/mouse. The use of multiple displays and/or input devices is prohibited. (Teams may bring a backup computer to use in case of equipment failure, but it must remain powered off and stored unless needed.) Please ensure that all previously written code is deleted from the system to be used for the contest.

The programming session is for teams only; contestants who advance only as individuals do not participate. If your team has four members, only three of those members participate in programming; it is up to the coach to decide which three.

Remember that calculators are **NOT** permitted for the written or programming tests.
