Tesla officials said it has officially moved its corporate headquarters from silicon valley to a large factory under construction outside of Austin, Texas, only 23 kilometers away from Leaguetown School.

Company officials made the announcement late on Friday, March 24, 2022, in a filling with US securities regulators that they had chosen among 2 cities:

Austin, Texas, and Palo Alto, Calif. Chief Executive Officer Elon Musk had said at the companies annual meeting in Oct. that the move was coming.

"The tax incentives down the road, we believe, will be massive when you compare Texas versus California", Ives says.

In US regulatory filings at the end of last year, Tesla said they had about 71000 employees world wide. Company news releases in 2020 said about 10,000 work at the headquarters and 10,000 are employed at it's factory in Fremont, Calif.

Chief Executive Officer Elon Musk hinted at making a move ever since a spat with Alameda County, California, health officials over reopening the factory in Fremont last year at the start of the Coronavirus pandemic. It wasn't clear if all of the headquarters employees would be required to move.

LISD officials said the company would still be required to pay school taxes but were unsure how much additional income that would mean for the school district.

Dr. Daniel Ives, an Assistant Professor of Business at The University of Texas at Austin said in October that he expects some of the 10,000 employees in Palo Alto won't want to leave the Bay Area, but says a large number will, due to Austins lower cost of living. He said he thinks Tesla will give many the option of staying but expects 40 percent to 50 percent to make the move.

No 3 - A reminder not to edit the content of tweets.

No. 4 — Ambrocio is a common first name. If the student thought the name was Ambrocios, then the apostrophe goes after the s per AP style — SINGULAR PROPER NAMES ENDING IN S: Use only an apostrophe.

Part 2

There are four errors per item.

If fixing one error creates another, it counts as one.

There is some subjectivity in all editing. If a student finds another "error" or rewrites a sentence, the judges will have to consider how to award points.

No state name is necessary following a city name if the state name is the same as the dateline, Texas in this case.

¶3 Ives is just a last name. Moving the last paragraph before this one solves that problem and puts the paragraph in a more logical order. Students may provide other solutions.

¶5 & ¶6 Passive voice is not wrong, but is incomplete. Who would require the move (or not)? Who would require the company to pay taxes?

Tips for judges

Part 3

This section is ranked to break a tie in the combined scores of parts 1 and 2. Assign no points.

Judges should compare the papers of students who tied, ranking them accordingly.

However, it is required. Students who do not make any effort on Part 3 will not be considered in the event of a tie. However, they will not be disqualified.

When grading part 3, holistically read the changes the student indicated starting with the highest level of editing.
Remember, there are multiple levels of copy editing.

- Highest level: Are there any legal or ethical issues with the story?
- Middle level: Does the story uses the right sources? Does it flow?
- Lowest level: Grammar, spelling, punctuation, style
