The game marked the end of Leaguetown coach Jeff Garcia's 24-year career. It was the darkhorse team's first appearance in the State Championship game, but they played in semi-final games three times in five years.

Leaguetown, making the school's first state tournament final appearance, went down in never give up fashion, battling back from an eight to two deficit after three ennings to make a game of it.

The end came with the potential tying run on-deck after a double off the left field wall by centerfielder Brandon Alaniz drove in two runs in the bottom of the 7th inning, putting the Lobos to within the final 3-run difference.

"There was some tension on that bench," said a tournament official stationed in the Lobos dug out. "At one point, the players we're fighting over there black eye make up that helps the players see in the bright sunlight."

Part 2

There are four errors per item.

If fixing one error creates another, it counts as one.

There is some subjectivity in all editing. If a student finds another "error" or rewrites a sentence, the judges will have to consider how to award points.

This section is worth a maximum of 10 points.

Notes for judges

¶1 Good feature story lead, but the writer never comes back to Barrera.

¶2 and ¶3 If Class 2A Baseball Championship Game isn't a proper noun the state championship in ¶3 certainly isn't. Be consistent.

¶3 At the beginning of the third line, the pronoun "they" refers to the team, a collective noun. There are several ways to fix this. One is presented here.

¶9 Some students may try to put the retirement higher in the story. It probably does warrant being higher than in the last paragraph.

Tips for judges

Part 3

This section is ranked to break a tie in the combined scores of parts 1 and 2. Assign no points.

Judges should compare the papers of students who tied, ranking them accordingly.

However, it is required. Students who do not make any effort on Part 3 will not be considered in the event of a tie. However, they will not be disqualified.

When grading part 3, holistically read the changes the student indicated starting with the highest level of editing.
Remember, there are multiple levels of copy editing.

- Highest level: Are there any legal or ethical issues with the story?
- Middle level: Does the story uses the right sources? Does it flow?
- Lowest level: Grammar, spelling, punctuation, style
