53% of Americans think it is accurate to say that immigrants who are here illegally do not have any rights under the U.S. Constitution.

37% can't name any of the rights guaranteed under the First Amendment.

74% can't name all three branches of government.

26% of respondents believe Brett Kavanaugh is the chief justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, and 14% of respondents selected Antonin Scalia, who died in 2016.

18% of respondents identified Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-NY), elected to Congress in 2019, as the author of The New Deal, a suite of public programs enacted by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1930s.

12% of respondents understand the relationship between the Emancipation Proclamation and the 13th Amendment, and correctly answered that the 13th Amendment freed all the slaves in the United States.

A large majority of teens age 13 to 17 in the U.S. (78%) say it's important to them to follow current events, and their news habits reflect the diversity of the modern media landscape.


More than half (54%) of teenagers say they find news at least a few times a week from social media platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter.



The essay matters.

The U.S. economy, the world's third-largest economy, is strong. The Gross Domestic Product is growing at about 2.6 percent per year. Unemployment was only 3.8 percent in February. Inflation is only 2.2 percent. While the national debt is about \$22 trillion, 113 percent of GDP, most economists say that is only unhealthy for short periods.

Not all other countries have economies that are that healthy.

Pick three other countries – not the United States – and discuss economic problems they have been having so far this academic year and the sociopolitical situations surrounding them.

As Robert Glazer said in an April 1, 2020 *Forbes* article, "With little warning, COVID-19 is changing everything about our lives – changes that are universal across generation. Although each generation will be affected differently, all will be forced to acclimate to a new normal."

And a Pew Research poll released March 30, 2020 showed that nearly 44% of U.S. adults say their life has changed in a major way.

COVID-19 has changed our way of life. First, discuss how the novel coronovirus has changed the way we work, play and learn. Second, include some of the major individuals and companies involved in this new, but temporary, normal. Finally, what steps do officials say will be required to get us back to work, play and school?

In setting foreign policy, the guiding principle is to serve the national interest. Whether it's political, economic, military or cultural, America's interest has to be considered when presidents make decisions regarding foreign policy. Ronald Reagan was seen as anti-Communist and his policies reflected that. "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall," he challenged the general secretary of the Community Party of the Soviet Union in West Berlin in 1987. George H.W. Bush dealt with Iraq. And Dwight Eisenhower effectively ended the Korean War and kept China out of Taiwan. But not all presidents are evaluated so positively when it comes to foreign policy. If the report card on the Biden administration's foreign policy were set in stone after his first year (or so), what grade would Biden get?

REPRESENTATION.

- (1) **Individual Competition**. Each participant high school may enter as many as four individuals in the district meet, all of whom may place. In districts with more than eight schools, district executive committees may elect to limit entries to three.
- (2) **Team Competition**. The individuals entered at district constitute the team. A team shall have a minimum of three contestants compete in order to participate in the team competition.

The **team score** is determined by adding the highest three individual scores in the objective portion of the contest. All four members of the winning team will advance to the next higher level of competition.
