Another set of test results shows the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on American sludents: National history seores dropped yel again, and eighlh graders lost significant ground in civies for the first time.

Nearly all of the nation's eighth graders fell behind in U.S. hustory and civies in 2022 compared with 2018 on the National Assessment for Education Progress, also called the Nation's Report Card, according to scores released Wednesday. Declines were expected because of the shift to remote teaching and the loss of instruction time when the pandemic hit. But for these subjects, experts also worry fristion over what shulents are taughl in American hislory classes, especially aboul race and slavery are a factor

## Civics score declines for the first time; score unchanged compared to 1998

In 2022, the average civics score at eighth grade decreased by 2 points compared to 2018. The average score in 2022 was not significantly different from 1998, the first year the assessment was given. The average score is reported on the NAEP civics scale, which ranges from 0 to 300.

It is more important than ever for our students to learn to listen to various viewpoints, synthesize information, and form their own opinions. It's also important that they begin to see themselves as actors of change from a young age. Implementing current events in the classroom is a strategy that will keep students aware of real-world problems and situations.

Americans have an abysmal knowledge of the nation's history and a majority of residents in only one state, Vermont, could pass a citizenship test.
Only $27 \%$ of those under the age of 45 across the country demonstrate a basic knowledge of American history. And only four in 10 Americans passed the exam.

Only $47 \%$ of U.S. adults could name all three branches of government, down from $56 \%$ in 2021 and the first decline on this question since 2016.

Less than $24 \%$ could name freedom of religion as a freedom guaranteed in the First Amendment, down from $56 \%$ in 2021.
$51 \%$ continue to assert incorrectly that Facebook is required to let all Americans express themselves freely on its platform under the First Amendment.

Freedom of speech was cited by $63 \%$, down from $74 \%$ in 2021 and $73 \%$ in 2020.

Freedom of religion was named by $24 \%$, down from 56\% in 2021 and $47 \%$ in 2020.

Freedom of the press was named by $20 \%$, down from 50\% in 2021 and 42\% in 2020.

Right of assembly was named by $16 \%$, down from 30\% in 2021 and 34\% in 2020.

Right to petition the government was named by $6 \%$, down from 20\% in 2021 and 14\% in 2020.

The number of individuals who incorrectly named the right to bear arms - which is guaranteed under the Second Amendment, not the First - tripled to 9\% from $3 \%$ in 2020 and 2021.
$26 \%$ of respondents believe Brett Kavanaugh is the chief justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, and 14\% of respondents selected Antonin Scalia, who died in 2016.
$18 \%$ of respondents identified Alexandria OcasioCortez (D-NY), elected to Congress in 2019, as the author of The New Deal, a suite of public programs enacted by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1930s.
$12 \%$ of respondents understand the relationship between the Emancipation Proclamation and the 13th Amendment, and correctly answered that the 13th Amendment freed all the slaves in the United States.

## THE ESSAY

## FROM THE CONSTITUTION

## REPRESENTATION.

(1) Individual Competition. Each participant high school may enter as many as four individuals in the district meet, all of whom may place. In districts with more than eight schools, district executive committees may elect to limit entries to three.
(2) Team Competition. The individuals entered at district constitute the team. A team shall have a minimum of three contestants compete in order to participate in the team competition.
The team score is determined by adding the highest three individual scores in the objective portion of the contest. All four members of the winning team will advance to the next higher level of competition.
