

ALL-STATE JOURNALISM STAFF CRITERIA - AMENDED FOR 2020

In order to recognize more deserving journalism students, "All-State Journalists" will be named every summer. Each student journalist named will receive a certificate recognizing him or her as an "All-State Journalist."

Qualifications

Any student involved in scholastic journalism in Texas is eligible for the All-State Journalism staff.

Criteria

Once students have met the initial qualifications, they are eligible to amass points, based on their achievements at UIL journalism competitions and ILPC and other state or national press association competitions.

Selection

To be considered as a candidate for the All-State Journalism Staff, the student must complete the application and provide a letter from the adviser certifying the listed awards.

Other activities that earn points

Award presented at summer workshops	2 points per award
Top position of staff	4 points
ILPC Editor of the Year (Producer/Photo Editor)	5 points
Texas Journalist of the Year	6 points
National Journalist of the Year	10 points

Other competitions will follow the same point schedule as either the state/national IAA contests or "On-Site" writing competitions, based on whether the competition places participants (1st, 2nd, or 3rd, etc.) or rates them (Superior, Excellent, etc.) Some of these competitions may include, but are not limited to, competitions through local newspapers or regional press associations, ATPI, yearbook company photo contests, Texas A&M-Commerce and Sam Houston State University photo contests, etc..

The selection of the "All-State Journalism Staff" will be based on the total number of points earned during one school year. Points do not carry over from one year to the next. Students must earn 50 points to be named as a member of the "All-State Journalism Staff."
