Athletic Events – Send a copy of the Athletic Event Advancing Entries to the respective Athletic Director of that sport immediately upon completion of the district contest. Alternates should be listed. (Director info on previous pages)

The appropriate Regional Director must grant authorization for late changes.

**JUDGING REQUIREMENTS FOR SPEECH EVENTS**

**Each UIL DISTRICT** sending competitors in Prose, Poetry, Informative, Persuasive and Lincoln-Douglas Debate must provide **SIX** judges:

- 2 judges qualified to judge Prose/Poetry prelims and finals.
- 2 judges qualified to judge Informative/Persuasive prelims and finals.
- 2 judges qualified to judge Lincoln-Douglas Debate prelims and elimination rounds.

The same persons (judges) can judge both LD Debate and Informative/Persuasive. It is important to note that rounds of LD Debate are on Friday and Saturday all LD judges **must be available for both days** of competition at the Regional Meet.

Competing schools' speech/debate coaches are eligible to serve as judges.

**Load In:** Your host will meet you and your company at the loading door. **Please be on time, if you are not please text Mike Doggett (361-676-6100) to let him know. Have your truck or bus unloaded and with all your things ready to enter the theater before your rehearsal time starts.** Have your things on either side of the shop door on the sidewalk. Following the rehearsal, the stage manager or technical director will show you where to store properties and your host will show you the room assigned to your company for your use during the contest.

**Site Rehearsals:** Because the contest day has been moved to a one day contest to avoid major conflicts only 40 minutes will be given for each rehearsal.. Be sure you use your time wisely and remember that a complete run-through will not be possible. Please arrive 15-20 minutes prior to your rehearsal to ensure that you have full use of your time. Please have your things unloaded on the sidewalk on only one side of the shop door.

**PLEASE REVIEW WITH YOUR STUDENT BEFORE THE REHEARSAL TO SAVE TIME:**

1. Do not drag anything, pick up everything to avoid pulling up other school's spike tape.
2. Spike tape will be provided, please do not use tape to put on actors shirts as spike tape is not cheap.

3. Curtain choices are grand drape, mid curtain (which is a little more upstage than mid) and back black curtain or cyc.
4. The grand drape, mid and back black pull with a rope stage left. All wing curtains are adjusted by hand. When pulling on them pull from the backside of the leg.
5. There are clear com communications headsets stage right and left and two in the control booth.
6. The apron of the stage does not have light, it's not a very big area. The judges are sitting very close to the stage.
7. Fully disclose all scenic elements.
8. Show any unique blocking that could be dangerous to the actor, including stage violence, jumping, falling or acrobatics.
9. Show all guns or swords to CM for approval
10. Show the beginning and ending moments of your show
11. Introduce your company member that will be receiving time warnings. This will happen before your site rehearsal starts.
12. Directors the following 3 questions:
  - a. 7 minute set and strike with the grand drape open or close.
  - b. Choice of lack upstage masking: back black traveler, mid stage traveler or cyc
  - c. Choice of spike tape color that will be first come first choice. Color available are blue, green, white, yellow, orange and pink. If you have a different color or corners you are welcome to use them. Please do not ask for a specific color ahead of your rehearsal.

**Pre-Programing Lights:** You will be able to send in your light cues before your rehearsal to be programmed if you like. Not required, but it will save you lots of site rehearsal time. The following links provided are video instructions for how the light cues need to be filled out and the light cue sheet that needs to be used if you want your lights pre-programmed before your rehearsal time. Please make a copy of the light cue sheet before you start editing it and use this exact light cue sheet when filling out your lights. **DO NOT USE YOUR OWN LIGHT CUE SHEET.** Please send light cue sheets to Graciela Reyna at [greyna@swisd.net](mailto:greyna@swisd.net) by **April 10th** to be recorded. If they are not sent in by April 10th then you will run the risk of not having your lights pre-programmed before your rehearsal. If the light cue sheet is filled out incorrectly then you will receive an email asking what needs to be fixed and to have it fixed as soon as possible so that they can be recorded on time. **Performances:** The casts are reminded not to re-enter the auditorium in makeup or costume after their performance. Remind your students they will not be allowed to enter the auditorium while a play is in progress. Plays will perform back to back.

**Time Warning Procedures:** The stage manager will be giving audible calls from the edge of the SR wings for set, strike and the 60-second start. The stage manager will give the 35-minute

warning over the intercom system. Your designated crew member should be on headphones and respond with “35-minute warning received.”

**Load Out:** If possible, please prepare to load your set out of the scene shop immediately after your performance. You will not be timed when loading from the shop to your vehicle. This will allow for more room in the scene shop as the shows progress during the day.

**Sound:** If you wish to use our sound system, please bring your music or effects recorded on CD or on an iPod/Phone. There will be a sound technician present to run sound. You may also bring your own adapter from any phone to aux cable.

**Unit Set:** The approved UIL Unit Set will be available at the contest site. Also available will be two door units and one French door unit.

**Makeup/Dressing Areas:** A classroom will be provided for each school. There will also be community dressing rooms that are available throughout the day. These are “Actor” and “Actress” dressing rooms that will be open for all companies to use as they see fit..You. r dressing rooms will be ready for you when you arrive

**Admission to the Performance:** Admission will be \$10 at the door. LATECOMERS WILL BE SEATED ONLY DURING THE PAUSE BETWEEN SHOWS. Please let families and friends know this since absolutely no exceptions will be made. Also, in order to maintain the proper atmosphere for enjoying a live performance, we ask you to let your families and friends know that no photographs, flash or otherwise, or videotape may be taken during the performances.

**Awards and Critiques:** The announcement of advancing plays, the presentation of awards and the oral critiques will follow the last performance as soon as the adjudicator has completed his decisions. **The critiques will happen simultaneously BEFORE the awards ceremony.**

**That final performing company will be in the second round of critique so that will give that company about 15 minutes after strike to get ready for critique. After critique time will be given to get changed for the awards ceremony while final tabulations and verifications are made by the contest manager and adjudicators.**

### **LOAD OUT:**

During your 7 minute set up you will strike directly to the sidewalk just outside of the shop and then load your bus or truck. Please only use one side of the sidewalk outside of the shop in case there is a delay with your bus or truck. You may also load out after the awards ceremony.

1. Please instruct your driver to not park in the middle of the driveway, park on one side so that cars or another bus or truck can park beside your vehicle if needed.

2. If there is rain, your things will remain in their storage spot until the end of the contest.

### **CRITIQUE:**

1. The first three schools to perform will be the first three schools to be critiqued 15 minutes after the final performance.
2. The last three schools will be critiques after the first round of schools.
3. Critiques will be 15 minutes each.
4. After the final round of critiques are over there will be a brief pause of about 15 minutes before the awards ceremony begins.
5. It is okay if the last school attends critique in costume if they do not have time to change after the strike. It's suggested that technicians and alternates load the truck while actors get changed before critique but there will be another brief pause before awards for actors to change if they were not able to before critiques.

**Load In:** Your host will meet you and your company at the loading door. **Please be on time, if you are not please text Nancy Pawelek (830-534-6240 ) to let her know. Have your truck or bus unloaded and with all your things ready to enter the theater before your rehearsal time starts.** Have your things on either side of the shop door on the sidewalk. Following the rehearsal, the stage manager or technical director will show you where to store properties and your host will show you the room assigned to your company for your use during the contest.

**Site Rehearsals:** Companies will have one hour to rehearse. Spike tape will be provided. Please arrive 15-20 minutes prior to your rehearsal to ensure that you have full use of your time. Please have your things unloaded on the sidewalk on only one side of the shop door.

**PLEASE REVIEW WITH YOUR STUDENT BEFORE THE REHEARSAL TO SAVE TIME:**

1. Do not drag anything, pick up everything to avoid pulling up other school's spike tape.
2. Spike tape will be provided, please do not use tape to put on actors shirts as spike tape is not cheap.
3. Curtain choices are grand drape, mid curtain (which is a little more upstage than mid) and back black curtain or cyc.
4. The grand drape, mid and back black pull with a rope stage right. All wing curtains are adjusted by hand. When pulling on them pull from the backside of the leg.
5. There are clear com communications headsets stage right and left and two in the control booth.
6. The apron of the stage does have light, and it's a very big area. The judges will be sitting at the house center.
7. Fully disclose all scenic elements.
8. Show any unique blocking that could be dangerous to the actor, including stage violence, jumping, falling or acrobatics.
9. Show all guns or swords to CM for approval
10. Show the beginning and ending moments of your show
11. Introduce your company member that will be receiving time warnings. This will happen before your site rehearsal starts.
12. Directors the following 3 questions:
  - a. 7 minute set and strike with the grand drape open or close.
  - b. Choice of lack upstage masking: back black traveler, mid stage traveler or cyc
  - c. Choice of spike tape color that will be first come first choice. Color available are blue, green, white, yellow, orange and pink. If you have a different color or corners you are welcome to use them. Please do not ask for a specific color ahead of your rehearsal.

**Pre-Programing Lights:** You will be able to send in your light cues before your rehearsal to be programmed if you like. Not required, but it will save you lots of site rehearsal time. The following links provided are video instructions for how the light cues need to be filled out and the light cue sheet that needs to be used if you want your lights pre-programmed before your rehearsal time. Please make a copy of the light cue sheet before you start editing it and use this exact light cue sheet when filling out your lights. **DO NOT USE YOUR OWN LIGHT CUE SHEET.** Please send light cue sheets to Kevin Dunckel at [kevin.dunckel@nisd.net](mailto:kevin.dunckel@nisd.net) by **April 10th** to be recorded. If they are not sent in by April 10th then you will run the risk of not having your lights pre-programmed before your rehearsal. If the light cue sheet is filled out incorrectly then you will receive an email asking what needs to be fixed and to have it fixed as soon as possible so that they can be recorded on time. **Performances:** The casts are reminded not to re-enter the auditorium in makeup or costume after their performance. Remind your students they will not be allowed to enter the auditorium while a play is in progress. Plays will perform back to back.

**Time Warning Procedures:** The stage manager will be giving audible calls from the edge of the SR wings for set, strike and the 60-second start. The stage manager will give the 35-minute

warning over the intercom system. Your designated crew member should be on headphones and respond with “35-minute warning received.”

**Load Out:** If possible, please prepare to load your set out of the scene shop immediately after your performance. You will not be timed when loading from the shop to your vehicle. This will allow for more room in the scene shop as the shows progress during the day.

**Sound:** If you wish to use our sound system, please bring your music or effects downloaded to an Ipad, Chromebook, or other compatible device. There will be a sound technician present to run sound. You may also bring your own adapter from any phone to aux cable.

**Unit Set:** The approved UIL Unit Set will be available at the contest site. Also available will be one door unit, 2 screen door units and one French door unit.

**Makeup/Dressing Areas:** A classroom or portable will be provided for each school. There will also be community dressing rooms that are available throughout the day. These are “Actor” and “Actress” dressing rooms that will be open for all companies to use as they see fit. Your dressing rooms will be ready for you when you arrive

**Admission to the Performance:** Admission will be \$10 at the door. LATECOMERS WILL BE SEATED ONLY DURING THE PAUSE BETWEEN SHOWS. Please let families and friends know this since absolutely no exceptions will be made. Also, in order to maintain the proper atmosphere for enjoying a live performance, we ask you to let your families and friends know that no photographs, flash or otherwise, or videotape may be taken during the performances.

**Awards and Critiques:** The announcement of advancing plays, the presentation of awards and the oral critiques will follow the last performance as soon as the adjudicators have completed their decisions. **The critiques will happen simultaneously BEFORE the awards ceremony.**

**That final performing company will be in the second round of critique so that will give that company about 15 minutes after strike to get ready for critique. After critique time will be given to get changed for the awards ceremony while final tabulations and verifications are made by the contest manager and adjudicators.**

### **LOAD OUT:**

During your 7 minute set up you will strike directly to the sidewalk just outside of the shop and then load your bus or truck. Please only use one side of the sidewalk outside of the shop in case there is a delay with your bus or truck. You may also load out after the awards ceremony.

1. Please instruct your driver to not park in the middle of the driveway, park on one side so that cars or another bus or truck can park beside your vehicle if needed.
2. If there is rain, your things will remain in their storage spot until the end of the contest.

### **CRITIQUE:**

1. The first three schools to perform will be the first three schools to be critiqued 15 minutes after the final performance.
2. The last three schools will be critiques after the first round of schools.
3. Critiques will be 15 minutes each.
4. After the final round of critiques are over there will be a brief pause of about 15 minutes before the awards ceremony begins
5. It is okay if the last school attends critique in costume if they do not have time to change after the strike. It's suggested that technicians and alternates load the truck while actors get changed before critique but there will be another brief pause before awards for actors to change if they were not able to before critiques.

The Shot and Discus weigh-in station will be in the Home Team Dressing Room. 6A boys shot put & 6A girls discus, from 7:00 am until 8:00 am. 6A boys discus and 6A girls shot put from 9:30 am until 10:30 am. 5A girls shot put and 5A boys discus from 3:00 pm until 4:00 pm. 5A boys shot put and 5A girls discus from 12:30 pm until 1:30 pm. All implements weighed in will be impounded and only certified implements will be placed in the pool for competition. All implements may be picked-up at the weigh-in station. 6A from 1:45-2:15 pm and 5A from 6:30-7:00 pm, Friday, April 28th. Athletes will be allowed to warm-up by flights prior to the start of competition with **approved** implements and under the supervision of an official.
- G. Pole Vault weigh-in will be in the east side storage room. 6A boys weigh-in from 7:00-8:00 a.m. and 6A girls 9:30-10:30 a.m., 5A boys weigh-in from 12:30-1:30 p.m. and 5A girls 3:00 – 4:00 p.m. It is the responsibility of the coach to verify that the competitor will use a legal pole rated at or above his/her weight by submitting the **pole vault weight rating sheet** contained in this handbook at weigh- in time. Each athlete will be weighed prior to pole vault competition to make sure that pole weight and competitor weight correlates with the rules. **There will be no variance.**
- H. No loud radios will be allowed in the stadium.
- I. Automatic timing system and video will be used for all running events.
- J. In running events with prelims, qualifying for the finals will be the winner of each heat and the next 6 fastest times.
- K. FOR RUNNING EVENT PRELIMS, ATHLETES SHOULD JUDGE THEIR WARM-UP ON EVENTS, BECAUSE TIMES ARE APPROXIMATE.
- L. Designated uniform for shot & discus participants must follow NFHS rules as specified.
- M. Only 1/8 or 1/4 inch spikes will be allowed

- N. NO chalk, tacks, pins, powder, paint, duct tape or any items that may cause injury may be used as marks for field events and relays. ONLY white athletic tape will be allowed on the track and runways and must be removed immediately after the relay race and/or field event competition.
- O. No cell phone usage or other wireless device used for communication will be allowed on the field or during competition. However, electronic devices may be used in unrestricted areas and the designated coaches' boxes.
  - a. Electronic devices shall not be used to transmit information to the competitor during the race or trial.
  - b. Electronic devices shall not be used for any review of an official's decision.
- P. Starting heights for the Pole Vault and High Jump will be determined by the UIL Director of Athletics and the Meet Director before the meet based on District/Area entries. They will be available on the NEISD website on Tuesday, April 25th and in the coach's packet upon check-in.

### III. UNIFORMS: COMPETITOR'S UNIFORM IN TRACK AND FIELD AND CROSS COUNTRY

**NOTE: The wearing of medical alert with the alert visible is encouraged for risk minimization. The ultimate responsibility to have each competitor compliant with uniform rules and other reasonable and legal items is with the coach.**

**ART.1 ....The competitor's uniform shall be school-issued or school-approved, worn as intended by the manufacturer, and meet the following requirements and restrictions:**

- A. Each competitor shall wear shoes on both feet.
  - 1. The shoes shall have an upper and recognizable sole and heel.
  - 2. The (shoe) upper must be designed so that it can be fastened securely to the foot.

NOTE: The games committee may also determine the length of spikes allowed on all-weather surface. (3-2-4a)

- 4. The use of slippers or socks does not meet the requirements of the rule.
- B. Each competitor shall wear a school-issued or school-approved full-length track top and track bottom or one-piece uniform. Any outer garment (e.g., t-shirt, sweatpants, tights) that is school issued or school-approved becomes the official uniform, when worn.
  - 1. When numbers are used, each competitor shall wear his/her assigned, unaltered contestant number.
  - 2. The top and/or bottom or one piece uniform may have school name, school logo, school nickname and/or competitor's name.
  - 3. The top shall not be knotted or have a knot-like protrusion. Bare midriff tops are not permitted. The top must hang below or be tucked into the waistband of the uniform bottom when the competitor is standing upright.
  - 4. Loose-fitting boxer-type bottoms or compression-style bottoms are permitted for boys and girls, however, **boys must wear a loose-fitting track bottom, and they must wear shorts over the one-piece suit or compression style bottoms according to the UIL Manual.** Closed-leg briefs are acceptable for girls. French or high-cut apparel shall not be worn in lieu of the uniform bottom. The waistband of a competitor's bottom shall be worn above the hips.
  - 5. A single manufacturer's logo/trademark/reference, no more than 2 ¼ square inches with no dimension more than 2 ¼ inches, is permitted on the top and bottom or one-piece uniform.

6. One American flag, not to exceed 2 inches by 3 inches, may be worn or occupy space on each item of uniform apparel. By state association adoption, to allow for special occasions, commemorative or memorial patches, not to exceed 4 square inches, may be worn on the uniform without compromising its integrity.
7. Any visible garment(s) worn underneath the uniform top and/or bottom is considered a foundation garment. Foundation garments are not subject to logo/trademark/reference or color restrictions.

**ART. 2...** Additional restrictions for relay teams and cross country teams.

- A. All relay and cross country team members must wear uniforms clearly indicating, through predominant color, school logo and color combination of all outer garments worn as a uniform, that members are from the same team.

NOTE: The official should be able to observe that all members are from the same team.

**PENALTY: (Articles 1, 2) For the wearing of an illegal uniform, when a violation is observed and noted by a meet official, the competitor shall be required to make the uniform legal before becoming eligible for further competition and shall be issued a warning that a subsequent violation shall result in a disqualification from the event.**

**The referee shall be notified of the violation by the observing meet official, and the referee shall then notify or cause to be notified the head coach of the offending school of the competitor's violations and warning.**

**ART. 3...** Removing any part of the team uniform, excluding shoes, while in the area of competition, as defined by the games committee, is illegal.

**PENALTY: This shall lead to a warning and if repeated, to disqualification from the event. If the Incident recurs, the competitor will be disqualified from further competition in the meet.**

**IV. COACHES:** *All NFHS and UIL rules will govern the events at the regional meet.*

- A. No district passes or TGCA or THSCA membership passes will be honored.
- B. A Wrist Band identifying Region IV coaches (Full-Time employee of the School District) with qualifying participants will be given out in the information packets and must be worn at all times at all sites. Do not remove the wristband if you plan on returning on Saturday. (three wristbands per team). Extra wristbands can be bought at packet pickup. \$20.00/band - Cash Only.
- C. All scratches/substitutes for events must be certified by the District/Area Track Meet Director by submitting the changes in writing to Kelly Parker @ Fax# (210) 491-6135 or by e-mail to [kparke2@neisd.net](mailto:kparke2@neisd.net) ***Please use the form in the Regional Meet Handbook titled Track & Field Substitute Certification Form.***
- D. **NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 10:00 A.M. ON TUESDAY, APRIL 25, 2023.**

- E. Relay cards are due on Friday, April 28<sup>th</sup> at the Heroes ticket booth at the following times:

**5A – 9:00 am and 6A – 2:30 pm. Names cannot be added or changed after the deadline.**  
*Relay teams will be subject to disqualification if relay cards are not turned in on time.*

- F. Appeals must be made by the coach in written form and submitted to a referee at the referee station under the video board **no later than 30 minutes** after the announcement of the event results. Forms will be provided in the coaches' packet and at the referee's table.

Situations which are subject to appeal include, but are not limited to:

1. Misapplication of the rules
2. Correction of clerical or team scoring errors which must be corrected up to 48 hours after the end of the meet, unless another time period is specified in advance by the games committee or meet director.
3. Correction of meet results involving an ineligible participant which may be made at any time.
4. Failure to follow a procedure contained in the terms and conditions of competition announced in advance by the games committee or meet director. This would include such items as the time schedule, the number of qualifiers to advance, number of trials, etc.

Non-appealable situations:

1. Any judgment decision pertaining to violations or alleged violations of the rules.
2. A decision made by the finish judges or timers that does not involve misapplication of a rule or the terms and conditions of competition.
3. Whether a start is fair and legal.

NOTE: SECTION 3-4: The referee has the sole authority for ruling on infractions or irregularities not covered within the rules.

- G. No coaches will be allowed on the field of competition during running events unless summoned by the referee or filing an appeal. A field marshal will escort the coach to the referee's table.
- H. A coach's box will be provided at all field event sites for coaches, 1 coach per team with approved UIL wristband AND meet issued colored wristband and only while their athlete competes.
- I. Video equipment authorized by the meet director and games committee may be used to review appealable infractions. The replay may be viewed only by the meet referee and/or the jury of appeals
- J. Trainers Station - Trainers from the host site (NEISD) will be on duty in the Northwest (Home) locker room. The host site trainers will be allowed on the track during distance races and if they are called to administer to an athlete. Trainers may not take pictures or review videos with athletes.

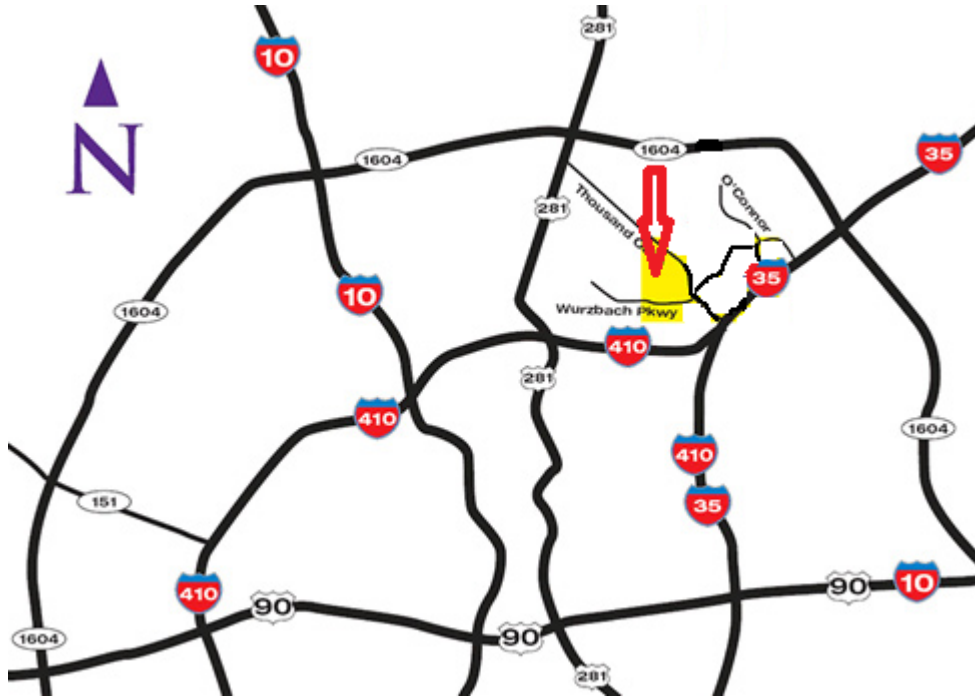

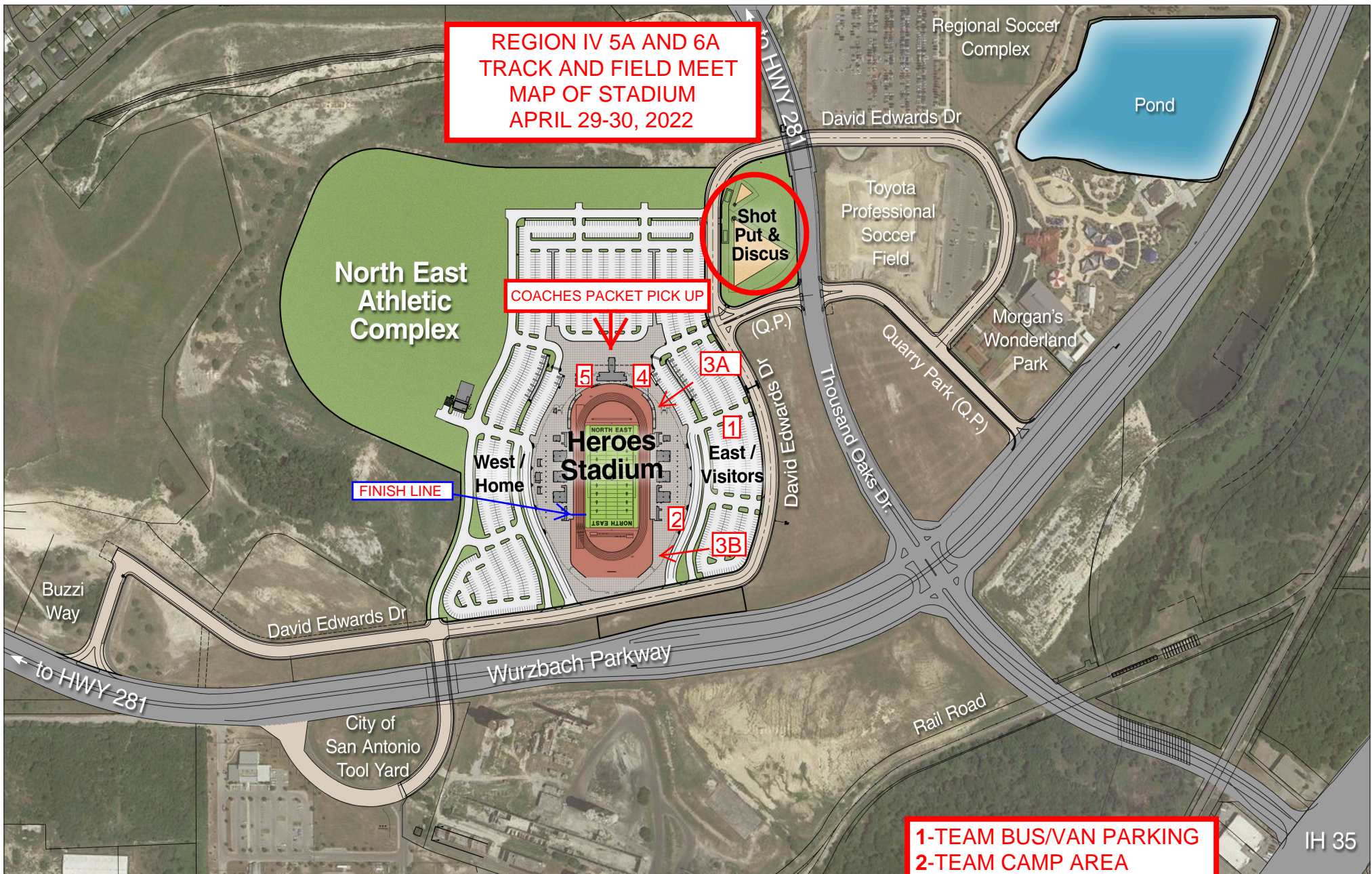

## **HEROES STADIUM**

### **TRACK MARKINGS**

#### **GENERAL**

1. The longest spike that may be used is the 1/4" pyramid.
2. No foreign materials of any kind should be placed on the track or jumping surface areas, including dusts, salt, powders, etc. If temporary markers are needed, the use of plastic or adhesive tape is acceptable, but should be removed as soon as the event is over.
3. The finish line for all events except the 100-M and 110-M Hurdles occurs at the southwest turn.
4. The curved white line at the southeast turn designates the break at the pole.

#### **EVENT DESCRIPTIONS**

- 100-M Dash** The white start line is located in the chute near the southwest turn. The white finish line is located on the west side of the track.
- 200-M Dash** The white start lines are located at the north end of the track and are staggered on turn.
- 400-M Dash** The yellow start lines are located at the south end of the track and are staggered two turns.
- 800-M Dash** The white start lines are located at the south end of the track and are staggered one turn.
- 400-M Relay** The start lines are identical to those used in the 400-M Dash. The exchange zones are typical and are colored gold.
- 800-M Relay** The blue start lines are located at the south end of the track and are staggered four turns. The exchange zones are typical and are colored blue except for the third exchange which utilizes the second exchange zone of the 400-M Relay, which is gold.
- 1600-M Relay** The green start lines are located at the south end of the track and are staggered three turns. The first exchange zone is typical and is colored green. The second and third exchanges take place between the broken green lines in each lane located at the southwest corner of the track.
- 100-M Hurdles** The start and finish lines are identical to those used in the 100-M Dash when running south to north. Hurdle settings are designated by gold triangles in each lane facing the direction of the finish line.

#### **10 Hurdles @ 33" - High School Girls**



**110-M Hurdles** The white start line is located in the chute near the southwest turn. The finish line is identical to that used for the 100-M Dash and the 100-M Hurdles when running from south to north.

Hurdle settings are designated by blue triangles in each lane facing the direction of the finish line.

**10 Hurdles @ 39"- High School Boys**

**300-M Hurdles** The white start lines are located near the southeast turn and are staggered one turn.

Hurdle settings are designated by green triangles in each lane.

**8 Hurdles @ 30"- High School Girls**

**8 Hurdles @ 36"- High School Boys**

**The following are NFHS Track and Field Rules relevant to pole vault safety:**

Rule 7-5-2: The vaulting pole may be of any material and of length and diameter. It may have a binding of not more than two layers of adhesive tape of uniform thickness. However, the bottom of the pole may be protected by several layers of tape, PVC, metal, sponge rubber, or other suitable material to protect it when placed in the planting box.

**Rule 7-5-3:** The competitor's weight shall be at or below the manufacturer's pole rating. The manufacturers must include on each pole: the pole rating that shall be a minimum of 3/4 inch in a contrasting color located within or above the top hand-hold position; a 1-inch circular band indicating the maximum top hand-hold position with the position being determined by the manufacturer. Prior to the competition, the Coach must verify that all of the schools' pole vaulters meet these requirements.

**7-5-4:** A competitor shall not use a variable weight pole, a pole which is improperly marked, or a pole rated below his/her weight, or any other equipment that is not legal during warm-up or competition. **NOTE:** Altering the pole in any fashion renders it illegal. **PENALTY: Disqualification from the event.**

**7-5-5:** Prior to warm-up, the field referee, head field judge, or assigned inspector of implements shall inspect each pole to be used in the competition to verify that the poles are legal equipment, per Rule 7-5-3. This includes checking the placement of a top hand-hold band, numerical pole ratings a minimum of 3/4-inches in a contrasting color located within or above the top hand-hold band, and the proper binding of not more than two layers of adhesive tape of uniform thickness. The binding shall not be on or above the top handhold band.

**7-5-23:** A competitor shall not be allowed to use the pole of another individual without the consent of the owner. The event judge shall approve the use and verify that the pole is rated weight-appropriate. **PENALTY: Disqualification from the event.**

**Rule 7-5-29h:** It is a foul if the competitor grips the pole above the top handhold band. **PENALTY: An unsuccessful trial is charged, but not measured.**

**The following are NFHS Track and Field Rules relevant to pole vault safety:**

Rule 7-5-2: The vaulting pole may be of any material and of length and diameter. It may have a binding of not more than two layers of adhesive tape of uniform thickness. However, the bottom of the pole may be protected by several layers of tape, PVC, metal, sponge rubber, or other suitable material to protect it when placed in the planting box.

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**7-5-23:** A competitor shall not be allowed to use the pole of another individual without the consent of the owner. 1. Please check that all athlete names are spelled correctly with correct capitalization (ex. John Doe is correct...not john doe or JOHN DOE.)
2. The “year in school” should be included for each athlete in the following format: 09 for 9<sup>th</sup> grade, 10 for 10<sup>th</sup> grade, 11 for 11<sup>th</sup> grade and 12 for 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

## **PILOT PROGRAM- WHEELCHAIR DIVISION**

Pilot program wheelchair division events for students in wheelchairs, boys and girls, to be held at the State Track & Field Meet:

- 100M Dash
- 400M Dash
- Shot Put

### **General Guidelines.**

- The Wheelchair Division will include participants from any conference 1A-6A.
- The wheelchair racing and seated shot put events will be incorporated into the state meet schedule by UIL staff.
- The athletes in the Wheelchair Division will compete in separate races and field events from the traditional athletes.
- The top nine (9) performances that meet the UIL designated qualifying standards will advance to the State Championships.
- The events are considered a pilot program and will be non-scoring events, meaning these events will not count towards any team championships.
- The top three athletes in each event will receive medals. Athletes will be able to set state records at the state meet only.

### **Eligibility For Participation In The Wheelchair Division.**

- Only high school students eligible under the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules Subchapter M are eligible to compete.
- All applicable UIL rules and regulations will apply.
- Any high school student may be eligible to participate in the Wheelchair Division track and field events with a documented permanent, physical disability. Each athlete's physical disability must be verified by a licensed physician and maintained on permanent file at the school.
- Schools and athletes are responsible for all aspects of participation in the events.

**Wheelchair Division Qualification Standards.** Participants must meet the following standard for each event in order to submit an entry to the state meet.

EVENT	BOYS	GIRLS
100M	:40	:45
400M	2:40	3:00
SHOT PUT	7'0" - 4K	7'0" - 6lbs.

### **Entry Requirements.**

- Participants must submit a qualifying mark or performance to be considered for participation at the state event. Performances will only be accepted through the UIL website at [www.uil texas.org](http://www.uil texas.org) no later than midnight on April 28, 2018.
- If more than nine participants submit eligible entries in any event, the top 9 performances will qualify for the state meet.
- A qualifying performance may be obtained from any local competition during the regular season, district, area, regional or Paralympic events from spring 2018. Entries must be verified by official meet results.



### **Entry Procedures.**

- School personnel will be required to submit verified qualifying performances.
- School personnel will be required to submit an official meet results document to verify the performance.
- A designated entry process will be provided on the UIL website [www.uil texas.org](http://www.uil texas.org) and due no later than April 28, 2018.
- All state qualifiers will be posted on the UIL website at the time they become available.

**100m, 400m Wheelchair Equipment and Racing Standards.** Athletes will be expected to compete in their school's team uniform. Reasonable accommodations will be made when necessary. Resources for track and field equipment information can be obtained from the following link:

- Manual wheelchairs only for track events, which may be specialized racing chair or an all sport chair.
- The racing chair may have two large wheels (not to exceed 70cm in diameter) and one small wheel (not to exceed 50cm in diameter).
- The racing chair must be manually propelled by pushing on the wheels or the hand rims. The chair shall not be equipped with gears, levers or electronic steering.
- All participants must wear a racing helmet that is a hard protective shell and should meet the safety standards of the American National Safety Institute (ANSI).
- Shoes are not required, however protective socks are recommended.
- All participants must start each event using racing gloves.
- Athletes' lower limb(s) must be secured to the track chair. Any touch of the ground by a lower limb results in disqualification from the event.
- Competitors are responsible for the proper functioning of the competition chair and equipment. Athletes that experience an equipment failure may finish the event; however, no event will be delayed or rescheduled if such an incident occurs.

**Shot Put Equipment And Seated Throwing Standards.** Athletes will be expected to compete in their school's team uniform. Reasonable accommodations will be made when necessary. Resources for track and field equipment information can be obtained from the following link:

- Implements shall meet NFHS regulations. The 4K shot put will be used for boys and 6lbs. shot put for girls.
- All participants must put the shot from a "chair" (manual wheelchair, throwing chair, power wheelchair). Scooters and "standing chairs" will not be allowed. Chairs may be designed based on the needs of the athlete.
- The upper most part of the cushion/seat on any chair may not exceed 75cm (29.5 inches) measured from the ground. The seat of the chair has to be square or rectangular and flat or sloped backwards.
- The chair may not have any moving parts or articulated joints.
- No part of the throwing frame or wheelchair may be outside of the circumference of the circle.
- The chair will be considered an extension of the athlete's body. For example: Any part of the chair touching the top of the stop board is a foul.
- A coach (only) may assist the athlete in getting to the competition area.
- A coach (only) may assist the athlete in entering and exiting the circle.
- Tie-down straps for the chair are recommended and should be provided by the athlete; however, a coach (only) may hold the chair during the throwing attempt to prevent excessive movement if no straps are available.
- The athlete's body must remain in contact with the seat during the throw.



## **Frequently Asked Questions.**

### **1. Who is eligible to compete in the Wheelchair Division?**

All athletes with a permanent physical disability on file with the school and in grades 9-12 who meet the eligibility standards in the C&CR Subchapter M may be eligible. The mobility of a student participant may or may not include or require the full time use of a wheelchair.

### **2. Where can athletes with physical disabilities compete?**

Wheelchair events may be held at any UIL sanctioned meet. Performances at meets held by groups, including the Paralympic events, could be accepted as qualifying marks for state meet entries provided the performance can be verified with official meet results and/or verification provided by the meet host. ### **3. How does an athlete in wheelchair participate for their high school track and field team?**

The athlete must follow the same procedures at their school established for traditional athletes competing in track and field.

### **4. Can wheelchair contestants compete against traditional athletes in the same race?**

Yes, in the 100m and 400m it is recommended that if this occurs the wheelchair athlete is designated to compete in the inside lane. Wheelchair athletes are coached to finish any race by following the curve of the track and need more than 20m to stop forward motion. Boys and girls heats may be combined for competition and separated at the conclusion to determine results and places for each gender and/or division.

### **5. Can wheelchair contestants compete against traditional athletes in the shot put?**

Yes, the wheelchair athletes may be flighted with the traditional athletes for the seated shot put throw. Physically challenged participants may choose to take all throws after entering the ring. The athlete's choice of type of "throwing chair" may determine if this is possible or if the athlete needs to be flighted before or after the traditional athletes.

### **6. How does a coach enter an athlete in the state meet?**

The athlete must be entered into the state meet through an online entry form available on the track page on the UIL website. Performance results will be required in order to complete the online entry process.

### **7. Can athletes racing on the track receive assistance from coaches or other personnel?**

No, athletes may only propel themselves forward through their own pushing of the wheels or hand rims.

### **8. Can athletes throwing the shot put receive assistance from the coaches or other personnel?**

A coach (only) may assist the athlete in getting to the competitive area and may also assist the athlete in entering and leaving the circle. Also, for throwing events, the athlete should provide tie-down straps. When no straps are available, a coach may hold the chair during the throwing attempt to prevent excessive movement.

### **9. Are the uniform rules in place for an athlete in a wheelchair?**

Yes, all uniform rules and regulations are in effect just as with the traditional athletes. Some exceptions may need to be considered and presented to meet officials for clarification.

### **10. Who is responsible for the athlete's equipment?**

The athlete is responsible for needed equipment. Schools may provide equipment and assistance may be available through Texas Regional Paralympic Sport upon request. Resources for track and field equipment

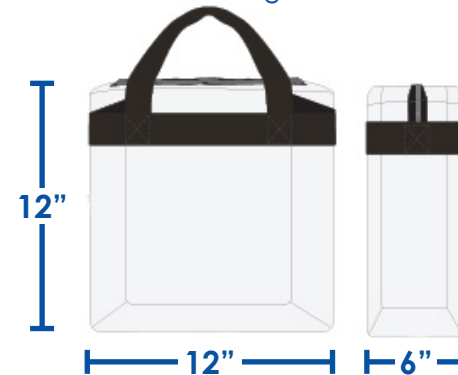

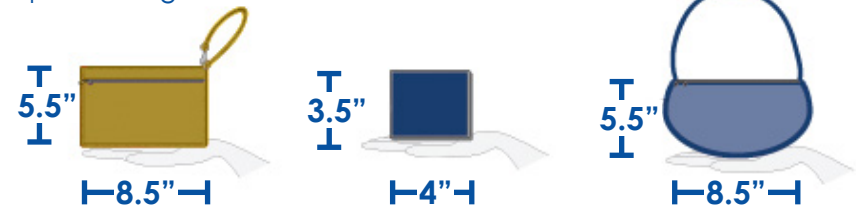
