Additional Meet Information

- Contest Verification. Contest directors will announce approximate times for verification and awards presentations at roll call for each event. Coaches or another representative of the school should be present at verification for each contest to verify results. Once the verification period has ended, results are final.
- Awards and Contest Materials. It is the responsibility of each school to collect awards and contest materials at the conclusion of each event on Saturday. Schools should plan to stay for the awarding of medals for each contest in which they have participants or leave a sponsor with a separate car to collect their team's awards and contest materials. Computer Science materials may be collected from the Academic Tab Room in Bay Hall 126 on Saturday afternoon. TAMUCC will not mail medals, tests or ballots to schools after the conclusion of the meet.
- Conflict Pattern. The UIL conflict pattern will be strictly observed at all region meets and at the UIL Academic State Meet. Please check the conflict pattern carefully before region to verify that your students are not competing in events that occur at the same time:

- **Drops/Substitutions.** Sponsors are obligated to notify both the District Director and alternate as well as the Region Academic Meet Director, Kelly Russell, should a contestant be unable to attend the Region Meet. If there are substitutions, please email the completed substitute form located in this handbook to Kelly.Russell@tamucc.edu
- Spelling and Vocabulary. If you will be accompanying spelling contestants to the region meet, please be present at roll call and volunteer to help grade and/or monitor the contest. Since we will hold the contest for both conferences (2A and 4A) in the same room at the same time, it would be ideal for coaches to grade the conference that is not their own. However, this is not a UIL rule. Coaches may grade their own conference as necessary.
- Computer Applications. All coaches are required to serve as graders, unless excused by the contest director. If a coach cannot grade, it is the coach's responsibility to provide a substitute, preferably someone somewhat familiar with the contest, and advise the director that they are providing a substitute. The contest director may disqualify contestants if a grader is not provided.

- 1. Each district is required to submit one judge for individual events (Saturday) which are: prose / poetry / informative / persuasive.
- 2. Each district is required to submit one judge for LD debate (Friday). That judge will be required to submit a Lincoln-Douglas Judging Philosophy form that is found in this Handbook. - 3. The same judge may be used for both days.
