*Complete the <u>BI-DISTRICT SPEECHWIRE ENTRY</u> ASAP after District competition.

Plan on arriving 30 minutes prior to your rehearsal time. This will ensure that we stay on schedule!

Directors, please bring all necessary documentation with you to your rehearsal:

- Permission to produce play not on approved list (from UIL)
- Publisher Permission to cut a full length play
- Proof of royalty payment (Approved copy of Check, Receipt from company)
- UIL permission for scenic items requiring special approval
- Permission to add characters or change character gender (if needed)
- Official scripts (Must be an original script, not a copy, and must have cuts if you are doing scenes from sf)
 - Substitution forms
- Set additions approval
- Community Standards Compliance Form with signature

Please make sure to read your OAP Handbook. If you fail to bring any of the necessary paperwork you will not be able to perform. All documentation must be presented prior to the start of your scheduled rehearsal.

ADDITIONAL PERFORMANCE/REHEARSAL INFORMATION

<u>Unloading</u>

Schools will unload equipment/scenery at the loading dock door.

Companies are welcome to unload all scenery and costumes 30 minutes prior to the scheduled rehearsal time (as indicated on schedule). Upon arrival you will be greeted by contest personnel.. On-site personnel will be there to assist with directives.

<u>Rehearsal</u>

Each group will have one hour to rehearse. *Groups will need to completely strike the stage by the end of the official rehearsal time.*

Please be on time. Events will run as scheduled.

<u>Strike/ Loadout</u>

Following your performance, each company will strike out to the dock and load out. If there is inclement weather, adjustments will be made. Following load-out, you will be escorted back to your dressing room.

Please use the parking lot adjacent to the high school for all buses and trucks and for visitor parking during the contest.

Dressing Rooms

Each company will be assigned a classroom during the duration of the competition. Please remember the dressing rooms are classrooms and do not contain mirrors: therefore, you will need to provide your own. As a courtesy to the classroom teachers, please leave rooms as you find them. Please refrain from sitting at the teacher's desk. Companies should strike all materials from dressing rooms prior to the Awards Ceremony.

Awards will be as follows:

*Three Advancing Play (plaques)

*One Alternate Play (plaque)

*Two Best Performers (gold medals)

*Eight All-Star Cast (silver medals)

*Eight Honorable Mention (bronze medals)

* Six Best Technician (one from each company) (gold medals)

Additional Things You Need To Know

- Schools need to arrive at least 15-20 minutes before their scheduled rehearsal time.
- <u>Regarding Strike</u>: Strike immediately after each show to the shop area; then you will go to critique in K 109. Then you load out onto your truck/bus after your critique.
- Holding/Warm-up Room: Blackbox Theatre
- <u>Com system:</u> Headsets are available for communicating with the backstage crew.
- Bring your own mirrors.
- <u>Reminder:</u> All schools will be using the bathrooms in the fine arts hall close to your holding rooms. Please remind your performers/crew to leave the space clean, removing all personal items including hangers, clothing, and cleaning all makeup residue.
- No loose glitter or baby powder on stage or in dressing rooms.
- There will be no concessions.
- There will be a hospitality room for DIRECTORS ONLY.


