AUSTIN, June 5 -- Dumas' Demons didn't get a base hit -- in fact, they didn't hit a fair ball out of the infield -- but they claimed a 2-0 victory over Jasper here Wednesday afternoon to win third-place honors in Conference AAA baseball.

Hard-luck Phillip Hennigan of Jasper, who had lost a 1-0 tangle to strong South San Antonio Tuesday, was the victim again. He allowed nothing like a base hit and struck out 12 -- but he walked six, and thereby hangs the story of the Dumas win.

Two of the bases on balls led two the two Dumas runs in the first inning, runs that were protected well by Demon pitcher Robert Robinett, who himself allowed only two singles to the losers.

Loadoff walks to Joe Ballard and Ronnie Smith, a pair of infield groundouts and a wild pitch gave Dumas its runs. The Demons managed only four baserunners -- all via walks -- the rest of the way.

Hennigan's no-hitter is the sixth in the 15-year history of the Interscholastic League state tournaments, and the first one in which the no-hit pitcher was the loser. It was the first such effort since 1960, when Charley Hartenstein of Seguin no-hit Snyder, 3-0.

Jasper's only hits were singles by Catcher Hugh Hamilton in the third and by First Baseman Gary Hennigan leading off the seventh.
