AUSTIN, March 11 -- Tulia's Hornettes, breaking open a close ball game with a 20-point third quarter, advanced to the finals of Conference AAA girls' basketball as they beat the Raymondville Bearkatettes, 65-49, here Friday night.

The win gives Tulia a 29-5 record. Raymondville now is 16-6 for the year.

Tulia will face defending state champion Victoria for the AAA title Saturday at 8:50 p.m. Raymondville will play Duncanville Saturday at 11:40 a.m. for third place. In Friday's earlier semifinal game, Victoria shaded Duncanville 53-50 in the final minutes of play.

Held to a 35-30 lead at halftime, Tulia outscored Raymondville 20-9 in the third quarter to take the ball game and earn a second trip to the finals in four tournament appearances. The 1962 Hornettes were edged by Devine, 38-37, for the Class AA championship.

Scoring honors were taken by Tulia's Freida Rosseau, who scored 39 points. Raymondville's leader, Jeanne Sullivan, had 35.

Raymondville went without a field goal for the first 13:59 of the second half, finally scoring with 2:01 remaining.

Tulia scored 13 straight points early in the third quarter to break the game open, and also had a 10-consecutive-point run spread around the break between the first and second periods.

Tulia hit 52 percent from the field, Raymondville 33.3.
