<u>Proposed Amendment to the</u> <u>University Interscholastic League Constitution and Contest Rules</u>

A. <u>Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment</u>

This proposal amends Section 1204(m), Flat Fee Schedule and Travel Reimbursement.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

This proposed amendment from the UIL Sports Officials Committee (SOC) adjusts the portalto-portal travel reimbursement for the UIL Officials Fee Schedule (1204). This amendment removes the last mileage range (91-120.9 miles) initiating travel reimbursement at 91 miles in place of the original 121 miles. This change is beneficial for schools and officials in remote areas further than 90 miles from the center point of the chapter.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Section 1204(m) of the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 1204: SPORTS OFFICIALS

- (m) Flat Fee Schedule and Travel Reimbursement
 - (1) The flat fee schedule and mileage reimbursement, as approved by the Legislative Council, shall be posted on the UIL website.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

The fiscal impact should be neutral for most member schools, and fiscally positive for schools in areas where population is less dense.

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment to Section 1207, *Rules, Violations and Penalties*, clarifies the authority of the UIL State Executive Committee and District Executive Committee when an assault of a sports official occurs by a student and requires schools to develop a policy for preventing a spectator who commits an assault of a sports official from attending future UIL events.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

This proposed amendment from the UIL Sports Officials Committee (SOC) more clearly states the authority of the UIL State Executive Committee and District Executive Committee to suspend a school or team when a member of that team commits an assault on a sports official. This amendment would also require schools to develop policies for suspending a spectator who commits an assault on a sports official from future events.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Section 1207(a) of the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 1207: RULES, VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

- (a) RULE VIOLATIONS. Students who violate the rules in the specific athletic plans shall be subject to the penalty in the specific athletic plan, or subject to the range of penalties applicable to student representatives in Sections 27 and 29. The regulations in the athletic plans govern all varsity and sub-varsity contestants. Ninth grade (whether in junior high, on a separate campus or with other high school grades) and other sub-varsity teams and contestants are restricted to the same game limitations, season, etc. as the varsity team.
 - (1) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO COMMITS AN OFFENSE UNDER SECTION 22.01 C 2 OF THE TEXAS PENAL CODE (ASSAULT OF A SPORTS PARTICIPANT) WHILE PARTICIPATING IN UIL CONTESTS WILL SUBJECT THEMSELVES AND ANY SCHOOL WITH WHICH THEY ARE AFFILIATED TO THE FULL RANGE OF PENALTIES IN SECTIONS 27 AND 29 OF THE CONSTITUTION, UP TO AND INCLUDING DISQUALIFICATION AND SUSPENSION.
 - (2) SCHOOLS SHALL DEVELOP POLICIES FOR PREVENTING ANY SPECTATOR WHO COMMITS AN OFFENSE UNDER SECTION 22.01 C 2 OF THE TEXAS PENAL CODE (ASSAULT OF A SPORTS PARTICIPANT) FROM ATTENDING FUTURE EVENTS IN ACTIVITIES SANCTIONED BY THE LEAGUE. THE POLICY SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE SCHOOL TO CONSIDER ALL CIRCUMSTANCES OF EACH INCIDENT WHEN DETERMINING THE LENGTH OF SUSPENSION FROM FUTURE EVENTS IN ACTIVITES SANCTIONED BY THE LEAGUE.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

This proposed amendment should have no fiscal impact to member schools.

E. Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment to Section 1220, *Baseball Plan* and Section 1280, *Softball Plan*, would modify the practice start dates for baseball and softball.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

This amendment would allow the UIL to set the date for the start of softball and baseball. The current rule does not allow schools to start practice until the 19th Friday prior to the respective state tournaments.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Section 1220(c)(1) and Section 1280(d)(1) of the UIL *Constitution and Contest Rules* would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 1220: BASEBALL PLAN

(c) PLAYING DATES.

(1) Practice Dates. There shall be no organized or formal school baseball practice for a contestant school or a team, before or after school, until the 19th Friday prior to the State Baseball Tournament, PRIOR TO THE DATE SET FORTH BY THE UIL CALENDAR, and after the date for certifying district champions, except for teams that have not ben eliminated from the playoffs.

Section 1280: GIRLS' SOFTBALL PLAN

(d) PLAYING DATES.

(1) Off Season Limitations. PRACTICE DATES. There shall be no organized or formal school softball practice for a contestant school or a team, before or after school, until the 19th Friday prior to the State Softball Tournament, PRIOR TO THE DATE SET FORTH BY THE UIL CALENDAR, and after the date for certifying district champions, except for teams that have not ben eliminated from the playoffs.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

This proposed amendment should have no fiscal impact on member schools.

E. <u>Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date</u>

ON JUNE 15, 2021, THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON POLICY MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE AT&T EXECUTIVE EDUCATION & CONFERENCE CENTER IN AUSTIN, TEXAS. BASED UPON ITEMS CONSIDERED, THE COMMITTEE TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS DURING ITS BUSINESS MEETING.



THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON POLICY

Moves that the Legislative Council

Pass the following proposals.

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment to Section 31, *Waiver Review Board; UIL Hearing Officer; Waiver Officer*, would expand the number of Waiver Review Board members from 10 to 12.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

Currently, the Waiver Review Board (WRB) consist of ten members, six elected members from each conference and four members appointed by the chair of the Legislative Council to reflect a sensitivity to ethnicity, gender and student population. The number of appeals has increased significantly in recent years which has led to more frequent hearings. This has caused additional work for the ten member panel. The two additional appointed members will ease the workload of the current WRB members.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Section 31(d) of the UIL *Constitution and Contest Rules* would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 31: WAIVER REVIEW BOARD; UIL HEARING OFFICER; WAIVER OFFICER

(d) COMPOSITION. The Waiver Review Board consists of ten TWELVE persons, whose terms begin on June 1. After consulting the chair of the State Executive Committee, the chair of the Legislative Council shall appoint four SIX members to serve for one (1) year. The selection of appointed members shall reflect a sensitivity to ethnicity, gender and student population size of districts. A member of the Legislative Council is not eligible to serve on the Waiver Review Board. Each of the six conferences shall elect a member of the board, who shall serve for four (4) years.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

This proposed amendment should have minimal fiscal impact on member schools.

E. Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment to Section 868, *Broadcasts of UIL Events*, would allow for UIL member schools to permit the live webcast of a regular season football game on a Friday night.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

A recent survey of UIL member schools showed an overwhelming majority in favor of allowing the live broadcast of Friday night football games on the internet. This amendment will allow for greater public accessibility to these games, particularly for individuals who could not otherwise attend the event inperson. This lifted restriction will apply only to webcasts streamed over the internet and <u>in accordance with UIL broadcast guidelines</u>. Other live telecasts including over-the-air television broadcasts will still be prohibited under this rule unless already permitted under Section 868(c) PILOT PROGRAM.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Section 868 of the UIL *Constitution and Contest Rules* would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 868: BROADCASTS OF UIL EVENTS

(b) RIGHTS GRANTED. The broadcast rights granted in a contract under this section may include, in whole or in part, every medium and/or visual content presently existing or that may be developed in the future. The rights granted may also provide for live and/or delayed broadcasts as well as ancillary programing, such as highlights shows.

A *delayed broadcast*, for purposes of this rule, is a broadcast of a UIL activity or event that begins at least one hour after the conclusion of the activity or event.

A *radio broadcast*, for purposes of this rule, is any live or delayed audio only broadcast of a UIL activity or event regardless of the means or medium of transmission.

A *telecast*, for purposes of this rule, is any live or delayed television or other broadcast of the visual content, images or pictures of a UIL activity or event regardless of the means or medium of transmission.

A *WEBCAST*, FOR PURPOSES OF THIS RULE, IS ANY TELECAST STREAMED OVER THE INTERNET.

(c) LIVE FOOTBALL TELECAST LIMITED. IN ACCORDANCE WITH <u>UIL BROADCAST</u> <u>GUIDELINES</u>, UIL member schools shall not MAY permit the live-telecast WEBCAST of a regular season football game on a Friday night. OTHER LIVE TELECASTS OF A REGULAR SEASON FOOTBALL GAME ON A FRIDAY NIGHT, INCLUDING OVER-THE-AIR TELEVISION BROADCASTS, SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED. Live telecasts and other types of live broadcasts of UIL football post-regular season games shall be permitted if provided for in a UIL broadcast rights contract.

PILOT PROGRAM: UIL is allowed an exception to Section 868 (c) to authorize the broadcast of a live Friday game or games on one Friday night during a single football season.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

This proposed amendment should have minimal fiscal impact on member schools.

E. <u>Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date</u>

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment to the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules, UIL-TEA Side by Side and Previous Athletic Participation Form (PAPF) amends UIL rules and policies to comply with HB547 passed by the 87th Legislature.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

These changes are required to address recent changes implemented by HB547 which allows homeschool students to be eligible for UIL activities, if approved by the local school district.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

UIL Constitution and Contest Rules (as well as Reclassification and Realignment policies and the TEA-UIL Side by Side Manual) would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 5: DEFINITIONS

(ss) NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT - MEANS A STUDENT WHO RECEIVES INSTRUCTION FROM A NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 29.916(A)(1) AND 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 351: CONFERENCE BASED ON ENROLLMENT

(a) ENROLLMENT. SCHOOLS THAT ALLOW HOMESCHOOL PARTICIPATION MUST NOTIFY THEIR DEC AND UIL BY AUGUST 1st.

Section 403: ELIGIBILITY - ATHLETICS

(f)(6)(D) CHARTER SCHOOLS. FOR NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENTS, IF THE PUBLIC INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT WHERE THE PARENT(S) / GUARDIAN(S) OF THE STUDENT RESIDE DECIDES NOT TO ALLOW NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE, THE NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT COULD PETITION FOR PARTICIPATION AT A CHARTER SCHOOL LOCATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT WHERE THE PARENT(S) / GUARDIAN(S) OF THE STUDENT RESIDE, IF ALLOWED BY THAT CHARTER SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION.

Section 406: FULL-TIME DAY STUDENT

(f) IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 407: REGULAR ATTENDANCE

(d) A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION, WHO IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE WOULD NOT BE SUBJECT TO THIS RULE.

SECTION 408: FOUR-YEAR PROGRAM OF HIGH SCHOOL COURSES

(a) A student may participate in UIL contests during a program of high school courses over a period of four consecutive years after the student first enrolls in the ninth grade. A student is considered to be enrolled in the ninth grade the day of that student's registration as a ninth grader and

attendance in a full class period (INCLUDING AN ATHLETIC PERIOD OR PRACTICE) at the ninth grade level.

- SECTION 411: CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY DURING FIRST SIX WEEKS (e) A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION FOR THE FIRST SIX WEEKS MUST DEMONSTRATE GRADE-LEVEL ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY ON ANY NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED, NORM-REFERENCED ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENT, SUCH AS THE IOWA TEST OF BASIC SKILLS, STANFORD ACHIEVEMENT TEST, CALIFORNIA ACHIEVEMENT TEST, OR COMPREHENSIVE TEST OF BASIC SKILLS PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL. A NON-ENROLLED STUDENT DEMONSTRATES THE REQUIRED ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY BY ACHIEVING A COMPOSITE, CORE, OR SURVEY SCORE THAT IS WITHIN THE AVERAGE OR HIGHER THAN AVERAGE RANGE OF SCORES, AS ESTABLISHED BY THE APPLICABLE TESTING SERVICE. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, A SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ACCEPT ASSESSMENT RESULTS ADMINISTERED OR REPORTED BY A THIRD PARTY.
- Section 442: RESIDENCE IN SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ATTENDANCE ZONE This section applies to the first calendar year of attendance in grades 9-12, AND TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1102: General Regulations

(b)(2) Grade Limits. No student in grades 6 and below may participate in UIL music competitions or events. Exception: Sixth grade students are eligible to participate in UIL concert and sight-reading evaluation under the following provisions.

(A) Orchestra. The student shall be enrolled in the corresponding music class of the ensemble that is participating in concert and sight-reading OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

(B) Band and Choir. The student shall be enrolled in the corresponding music class of the ensemble that is participating in concert and sight-reading and the band or choir shall be comprised of a majority of 7th grade students or above OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1205: ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

(e) SUB-VARSITY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. An individual is eligible to participate in UIL contests if that individual is a full-time student of the member school the student represents, has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education, and is passing the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education; OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1206: SCHOOL PRACTICE AND GAME RESTRICTIONS

(d)(1) Accelerated physical education activities, calisthenics, skills, strength training or conditioning exercises may be conducted during the school year within the school day provided such activities do not exceed one regular classroom period, not to exceed 60 minutes when classes meet every day (300 minutes per week for block schedules). THIS PROVISION APPLIES TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1207: RULES, VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

(d) Unattached Participation. In any UIL member school sponsored athletic contest, meet or tournament, UIL member high school students shall not be permitted to enter unattached. The penalty for violation of this rule shall be assessed against the member school(s) in violation. THIS PROVISION APPLIES TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1208: ATHLETIC REGULATIONS

(u)(3) Participating With Other Leagues. A UIL member school that participates in an athletic activity offered by the UIL in a non-UIL league under the auspices of any other sanctioning organization is subject to the range of penalties, up to and including suspension from UIL athletic activities. THIS PROVISION APPLIES TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 1400: JUNIOR HIGH (SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADES)

- (a)(1) Student's Eligibility. An individual may participate in UIL competition or contests as a representative of the participant school he/she attends if that student has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education, and is passing the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education; OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.
- (b)(1) Has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education and is passing the courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education; OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

SECTION 1478: SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADE ATHLETIC PLAN

(b)(5) - Is a full-time student in grade seven or eight at the school he/she represents, OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Exception: Seventh and eighth grade students from public K-8 ISDs that do not field a team, may participate on the seventh and eighth grade baseball, basketball, football, soccer, softball and/or volleyball teams at the junior high school in the attendance area where they reside or which is a part of the designated receiving school district. (Parochial AND private, and home-schooled students are not eligible.)

- (b)(6) Has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education, and is passing the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education; OR IS A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL PROVISIONS INCLUDED IN SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.
- (d)(13) Physical Education/Athletic Periods. No student shall be enrolled in more than one physical education or athletics class per school day. Schools may use a seventh, eighth or zero period concept for athletics, provided no student enrolled in the class is enrolled in any other physical education/athletics class. This period shall not exceed 60 minutes per day (or 300 minutes per week on a block schedule) and the allotted time includes time for dressing and re-dressing in street clothes. Refer to Section 1206 (d). THIS PROVISION APPLIES TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

TEA-UIL Side by Side:

First Six weeks:

UIL participants are eligible to participate in contests during the first six weeks of the school year provided the following standards have been met:

• Students beginning in grades nine and below must have been promoted from the previous grade prior to the beginning of the current school year.

• Students beginning their second year of high school must have earned five credits, which count toward state high school graduation requirements.

• Students beginning their third year of high school either must have earned a total of ten credits which count toward state high school graduation credits or have earned a total of five credits which count toward state high school graduation requirements during the 12 months preceding the first day of the current school year.

• Students beginning their fourth year of high school either must have earned a total of 15 credits which count toward state high school graduation credits or have earned a total of five credits which count toward state high school graduation requirements during the 12 months preceding the first day of the current school year.

A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT SEEKING PARTICIPATION FOR THE FIRST SIX WEEKS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE MUST DEMONSTRATE GRADE-LEVEL ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY ON ANY NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED, NORM-REFERENCED ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENT, SUCH AS THE IOWA TEST OF BASIC SKILLS, STANFORD ACHIEVEMENT TEST, CALIFORNIA ACHIEVEMENT TEST, OR COMPREHENSIVE TEST OF BASIC SKILLS PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

A NON-ENROLLED STUDENT DEMONSTRATES THE REQUIRED ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY BY ACHIEVING A COMPOSITE, CORE, OR SURVEY SCORE THAT IS WITHIN THE AVERAGE OR HIGHER THAN AVERAGE RANGE OF SCORES, AS ESTABLISHED BY THE APPLICABLE TESTING SERVICE. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, A SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ACCEPT ASSESSMENT RESULTS ADMINISTERED OR REPORTED BY A THIRD PARTY.

After the first six weeks:

A student who receives, at the end of any grading period (after the first six weeks of the school year), a grade below 70 in any class (other than an identified class eligible for exemption) or a

student with disabilities who fails to meet the standards in the Individual Education Plan (IEP) may not participate in extracurricular activities for three school weeks (SEE INFORMATION FOR NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENTS BELOW). An ineligible student may practice or rehearse, however. The student regains eligibility after the seven calendar day waiting period has ended following a grading period or the three school week evaluation period when the principal and teachers determine that he or she has earned a passing grade (70 or above) in all classes, other than those that are exempted.

All activity coaches and directors are responsible for obtaining official grade reports from the individual the principal designates as the keeper of official grades before the student represents the school. This provision applies to all grading periods. It also applies to all three-school week evaluation periods for ineligible students.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33.0832 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE, THE PARENT OR PERSON STANDING IN PARENTAL RELATION TO A NON-ENROLLED (HOME SCHOOLED) STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN A LEAGUE ACTIVITY ON BEHALF OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL MUST PERIODICALLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SCHOOL'S GRADING CALENDAR, PROVIDE WRITTEN VERIFICATION TO THE SCHOOL INDICATING THAT THE STUDENT IS RECEIVING A PASSING GRADE IN EACH COURSE OR SUBJECT BEING TAUGHT.

D. Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools

This proposed amendment should have minimal fiscal impact on member schools.

E. Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date

A. Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment

This amendment adds language to the Constitution and Contest Rules in order to comply with a new state law regarding assault of an official and the length of suspension for participants.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

This is required in order to comply with state law.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

Sections 26(c), 27(a), b and 29(a) of the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules would be amended as follows, pending approval by the Commissioner of Education:

Section 26: STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(c) JURISDICTION. New 9 (renumber remaining) – A REQUEST FOR PERMISSION TO PARTICIPATE AS OUTLINED IN SECTION 33.081 E-2 THROUGH E-4 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 27: PENALTIES THE STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CAN IMPOSE

(a) FOR STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES.

(2) Individual Suspension. If the State Executive Committee finds that a student has failed to comply with the rules it may suspend the student from competition, including practices, in all germane activities for one (1) day to three (3) years. Suspension may include a probationary period of up to three (3) years, and may include any reasonable conditions, which, if not fulfilled, may result in additional suspension. SEE SECTION 33.081 E-1 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

- (b) STUDENT PENALTY GUIDELINES.
 - (3) Enhanced Penalty Factors

(C) Intent/Harm - In cases where a Category A violation is found to be deliberate and to have provided a competitive advantage to the student violator or the violation cased physical harm to a person or property, the penalty for a Category A violation may be enhanced. An enhanced penalty for such violators may include reasonable conditions and/or the imposition of a probation period of up to three (3) years and may also include a period of suspension from competition, including practices, in all germane activities for a period of one (1) day to three (3) years. SEE SECTION 33.081 E-1 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

Section 29: PENALTIES THE DISTRICT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CAN IMPOSE

(a) FOR STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES.

(2) Individual Suspension. If a District Executive Committee finds that a student has failed to comply with the rules it may suspend the participant student from competition, including practice, in all germane activities for up to three (3) years. Suspension may include a probationary period of up to three (3) years, and may include any reasonable conditions, which, if not fulfilled, may result in additional suspension. For students found to have changed schools for athletic purposes, [Refer to Section 443 (f) (3)]. SEE SECTION 33.081 E-1 OF THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE.

D. <u>Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools</u>

Minimal fiscal impact is expected as a result of this proposal.

E. Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date

A. <u>Brief Explanation of Proposed Amendment</u>

This amendment to the UIL *Constitution and Contest Rules*, UIL-TEA Side by Side and Previous Athletic Participation Form (PAPF) amends UIL rules and policies to comply with legislation passed by the 87th Legislature.

B. Factual and Policy Justifications

This amendment would allow for UIL staff to make changes to UIL documents and policies to comply with legislation passed by the 87th Legislature for UIL activities.

C. <u>Proposed Amendment</u>

The UIL Legislative Council authorizes UIL staff to make additional changes to UIL documents and policies to stay in compliance with requirements passed by the 87th Legislature. The UIL Executive Director will notify UIL Legislative Council of any changes.

D. Potential Fiscal Impact of the Proposed Rule to Member Schools

This proposed amendment should have minimal fiscal impact on member schools.

E. <u>Legislative Council Consideration; Effective Date</u>

THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON POLICY Passed the Following Proposals
